\$2.5 Million Matching Donation Pledged for Island Gym

Nonprofit formed in memory of former student

The Washington Island School District plans to fund the construction of its own gymnasium through a nonprofit formed in memory of former student, Bradley Jordan, who died July 9, 2023, after the motorcycle he was driving was struck by another motorist.

Through the Bradley Jordan Foundation, an anonymous group of donors have pledged to match up to \$2.5 million in donations, just over half the cost of the project.

Currently, the school rents gym space in the town's Community Center. The space's limitations and its location away from the school mean the school's needs have outgrown the current facility, explained Sue Cornell, administrator of business services at the Washington Island School.

The gym project has been on the district's back burner since 2015. Michelle Jordan, director of special education at Washington Island and Bradley Jordan's mom, said she and Cornell decided to bring the project back in memory of her son.

"Sue [Cornell] and I just looked at each other and thought, what if we just did it in Bradley's memory?" she said. "So we call together a group of individuals that we actually knew would be vested to try to see what we could do to get this gym built, and let Bradley's memory live on in our town, in our school, and in Door County."

Both Jordan and Cornell serve on the board of the non-profit foundation the group formed to field donations for the new gym.

Plans for the new gym, which would be named the Bradley Jordan Memorial Gym, include a full-sized high school regulation court with a curtain that can drop and divide the space into two junior-sized courts. The space also has



two locker rooms, a concessions area and bleacher seating for guests.

Not only would the gym be larger than the current facility the school districts rents, it would enable the district to host tournaments, something it's not been able to do in the past. Spectators are also limited in the current space, whereas the new gym would have designated seating.

One of the biggest benefits of this facility, Cornell said, would be its location on school grounds. The present situation, where students leave the school and walk to the town gym, is unsafe, she explained.

"Our students, now, walk across in snow, rain, whatever you can imagine - they have to walk down the hill," she said.

The CJ Meyer company provided plans for the gym at no cost, but the district will need to fund its construction. Soon after

forming the Bradley Jordan Foundation with the hope of raising those funds, the organization received a pledge from a group of anonymous donors to match the first \$2.5 million in donations. With construction costing an estimated \$4.3 million, the \$5 million they could raise with this pledge is set to cover the expenses, according to Jordan and Cornell.

"Having the group of people [donors] come forward was just a huge game-changer for us," Jordan said.

Depending on the rate at which they collect donations, construction could begin as early as this coming spring.

Jordan said this project has been a way to work towards a necessary facility for the school while also memorializing her son, who loved sports himself.

"He certainly was a really awesome guy," she said. "He was fun and he was funny, and he was a three, four-season athlete, and so to have something that has his name on there makes the gym more special. We miss him horribly."

The Bradley Jordan Foundation is currently accepting donations for the construction of the Bradley Jordan Memorial Gymnasium, which can be sent to Nicolet National Bank, located at 1131 Main Road on Washington Island, and PO Box 251 on Washington Island.

GIRLS HOOPS PRACTICE UNDER WAY

Practice began this week for Door County's high school girls basketball teams.

All but one of the county's schools had non-conference games set for next week to open the 2024-25 campaign.

Sturgeon Bay is set to open the season at home Nov. 19 against Chilton, before playing another non-league game on the road Nov. 21 against Two Rivers. The Clippers are then slated to host their Packerland opener Nov. 26 against NEW Lutheran.

Gibraltar, which hosts a scrimmage this Saturday with Sturgeon Bay, will also host Washington Island on Nov. 22 before playing a non-league road game Nov. 25 against Suring.

Last season's Packerland co-champion, Sevastopol, opens the season Nov. 21 with a non-conference game at Hilbert, before hosting Bonduel on Nov. 25.

Southern Door only has one game scheduled before Thanksgiving when the Eagles play Nov. 26 at North Fond du Lac.

The WIAA allows official practices to begin Nov. 18 for boys basketball, wrestling and boys swimming.

ACROSS THE BAY TEAM IN STATE TITLE GAME

One Across the Bay Conference team has advanced to play in this Saturday's WIAA 8-Player Football State Championship in Wisconsin Rapids.

Lena/St. Thomas Aquinas, which placed second in the conference, will play for the title against Owen-Withee. Both teams are making their first appearance in the eight-player championship game.

Lena/St. Thomas Aquinas finished 5-1 in the Across the Bay, one win behind league champion Algoma, which was ineligible for the eight-player playoffs this season because its three-year enrollment average for high school exceeded 200 students.

Sevastopol placed third in the conference at 4-2, and Lena/St. Thomas Aquinas was the only Across the Bay team to qualify for the 16-team bracket in the eight-player football playoffs.

Lena/St. Thomas Aquinas defeated Wausaukee (24-12), Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah (44-0) and Northwood/Salon Springs (38-14) to advance to the title game.

DCU Qualifies for State in Seven Events

The Door County United (DCU) cooperative high school girls swimming team qualified for state in seven events after placing third at Saturday's WIAA Division 2 sectional at Ashwaubenon.

In addition to the sectional champions in each event automatically qualifying for the Nov. 15 Division 2 state meet at the Waukesha South Natatorium, the next 12 fastest individuals/relays who were not champions in all four of the sectionals combined also qualified.

DCU senior Julia Michalski automatically qualified for the state meet after finishing first in both the 200-yard individual medley (2 minutes, 13.34 seconds) and 100 backstroke (1:00.51).

The other two individual qualifiers for DCU included junior Kailyn Neville placing third in the 200 freestyle (2:01) and senior Caitlyn Hasenjager finishing fourth in the 100 breaststroke (1:11.21). It marked the first time Hasenjager qualified for state as an individual.

All three of DCU's relays also qualified for state. They included: Michalski, Hasenjager, senior Izzy Jimenez-Seyfer and freshman Megan Quaderer in the 200 medley relay (second in 1:55.39); junior Chloe Bissen, Quaderer, Neville and Hasenjager in the 200 freestyle relay (fifth in 1:45.42); and Michaleski, Bissen, Neville and Hasenjager in the 400 freestyle relay (fourth in 3:45.37).

DCU recorded top-eight finishes in all but one swimming event, the 50 freestyle. Among the top-eight

finishes which didn't earn a trip to state were:

- Neville, 500 freestyle (sixth in 5:43.22).

- Jimenez-Seyfer, 100 butterfly (eighth in 1:07.96).

- Bissen, 100 butterfly (fifth in 1:04.73) and 100 backstroke (third in 1:05.84).

- Freshman Amelia Michalski, 100 freestyle (seventh in 59.52) and 100 breaststroke (sixth in 1:14.74).

- Quaderer, 100 freestyle (fourth in 57.73) and 500 freestyle (seventh in 6:01.45).

- Freshman Quinn Sperber, 100 backstroke (fifth in 1:07.44).

The Kohler/Sheboygan Lutheran/Sheboygan Falls co-op won the sectional team title with 327 points, followed by Ashwaubenon (323) and DCU (298).
